Professor Deliang Chen

Professor Deliang Chen is an internationally renowned climate researcher. He has made important contributions to the understanding of regional climate changes in Sweden and China. He is an elected member of the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences and has served on numerous international and national committees and boards.

Professor Deliang Chen is currently the Executive Director of the International Council for Science (ICSU). ICSU plans and coordinates international research programmes addressing various themes in climate and environmental sciences.
